BY CAR

Manchester is served by an excellent motorway network. The M62 links Manchester with Leeds and the Humber ports in the East and Liverpool in the West whilst the M6 takes you to Birmingham and London in the South and the Scottish border to the North. If you are coming from Chester or North Wales you can reach Manchester on the M56. The M61 links with Preston in the north. Manchester is surrounded by the M60 ring road.

BY AIR

Manchester Airport is about 20 minutes drive (10 miles) from central Manchester, accessible via the M56. The airport serves many airlines and services direct flights from most European cities. BY RAIL

Manchester has two mainline train stations that service the region and the whole of the UK.

Piccadilly Railway Station is the principal railway station of Manchester. It serves intercity routes to London, Birmingham and the south, Glasgow and routes to the north of England. It is also the terminus for the Metro Link Rapid Transit Tram which connects Piccadilly with Victoria Station.

Victoria Railway Station is the second of Manchester's mainline railway stations. It is located to the north of the city centre and it mainly services destinations to the north and east and has some trains to Liverpool. For information on rail travel within the UK contact the 24 hour
